Do It With Me Story: God Made Me

Did you know that God gave you five senses? It's true! He gave you eyes to see. Point to your eyes. He gave you a nose to smell. Point to your nose. He gave you fingers to feel. Point to your fingers. He gave you a tongue to taste. Point to your tongue. And He gave you ears to hear. Point to you ears. Let's learn a little bit more about each of these five senses.

God gave us eyes to see. I am looking around the room and I see _____. (For this part of the story, look around your room and describe things you see without actually saying what the object is. For example, if you are looking at a clock, you might say, "I see something round with numbers on it and two little hands. What is it that I see?" The boys and girls should respond by saying, "A clock." Give them praise then move on to the next object. Do this about five times before moving to the next paragraph.)

God gave us a nose to smell. There are so many great things to smell in this world. What's that I smell? (Pretend to sniff and hold a pretend flower up to your nose.) These things grow in my garden and sometimes smell like perfume? What am I smelling? (Flowers) That's right! Now I smell something really yummy! It's a big round circle with cheese and sausage and pepperoni, too. What am I smelling? (Pizza) That's right! Now I smell something coming out of that chimney over their on top of the yellow house. What am I smelling? (Smoke) That's right! Now I'm smelling something really beautiful. I smell this when I see my mom take the lid off of a pretty jar of liquid. She puts it behind her ears and a little on her wrist. What am I smelling? (Perfume) That's right! Pee-Yew! What's that smell? (Pinch your nose.) Daddy just took off his socks! What am I smelling? (His feet) That's right! We'd better leave this room fast!

God gave us fingers to feel. Can you tell me something that feels soft? (They might say feathers or a teddy bear.) Can you tell me something that feels hard? (They might say the floor or a brick.) Can you tell me something that feels scratchy? (They might say their clothes or their dog's hair.) Can you tell me something that feels slimy? (They might say toothpaste or noodles.) Can you tell me something that feels wet? (They might say water or their bathtub.) Good job! Those are all excellent answers!

God gave us a tongue to taste. Let's see if you can guess what kinds of foods I am thinking about. Mmmm! Grandpa made these for breakfast this morning. They are small round circles and kind of soft. I like to put syrup on them. What food did I taste at breakfast? (Pancakes) That's right! Yesterday I went to McDonald's and got some long thin stringy things that tasted like potatoes. What did I taste at McDonald's? (French fries) That's right! The other day, I made some broccoli, but it tasted kind of bland. So, I reached across the table and grabbed a little jar with something white inside of it. I sprinkled just a little bit on my broccoli. The white stuff made my vegetable taste better! What was the white stuff I tasted? (Salt) That's right! Last summer was so hot! Just about everyday I made a yummy drink made from a yellow fruit that tastes real sour by itself. But after I added some sugar, my drink was delicious. Do you know what fruit I used in my drink? (A lemon) That's right! All this talk about food is making me hungry!

God gave me ears to hear. What sound does the bird make? (Tweet-tweet) What sound does a motorcycle make? (Vroom-vroom) What sound does a police siren make? (Rrrhhhhhh) What sound does a crying baby make? (Waaaaah!) What sound does a kiss make? (Pucker lips and kiss) And a kiss means "I love you!" and God loves you too!
