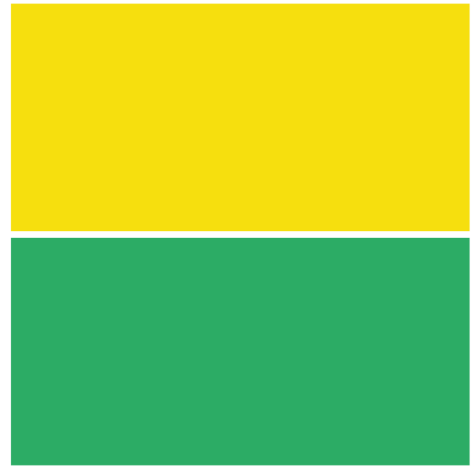
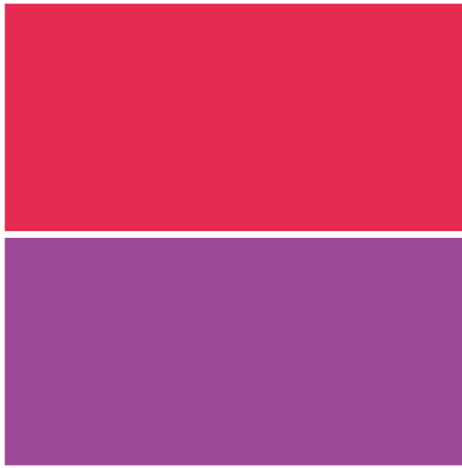

Thank you for downloading a "Scripture Lady Bible Review Game"!
Here is your download of "The Sword, Flame, Hammer, Lamp Game".
Just follow the directions below and have FUN!

I love how the Word of God is so visual and how exciting it is to know that God's Word can be described by such great objects as a Sword, a devouring Flame, a crushing Hammer and a Lamp unto our Feet! These are things that kids know. Now it's your job to have fun with this game and put the Word of God into their hands, minds and hearts.

Assembly: Cut out all cards along the black lines. Back all the cards with the small title backings and then laminate all the cards so that they will last for a long time.

Set Up: For this game, I use a pocket chart (approx. 28" square). (You can find pocket charts at your local teacher supply store or online at www.orientaltrading.com) Place all 28 cards onto the pocket chart in random mixed up order with the backing titles showing. Pick a scorekeeper to keep track of all scoring. I always use a white board sitting on an easel for scoring. I also place my pocket chart on an easel.

How to Play: Divide your children into 2 teams. Decide who will go first. Give a child from the first team a multiple choice question found below. If he gets it correct, he now gets the chance to pick a card off the board without showing it to anyone. You, as the teacher, also get to pick a card off the board without showing it to anyone. Now cue your class to say, "Sword, Flame, Hammer, Lamp!" Once the word "Lamp" is shouted, both the child and teacher reveal their cards. The one who is holding the picture with the highest score gets the points. Now it's the next team's turn. Have them follow the same procedure until you have asked all the multiple choice questions. The team with the most points wins. So, in this game the teacher could actually win! Sounds like fun, huh?

Tip: If the teacher and child pick identical cards, the points go to the child's team.

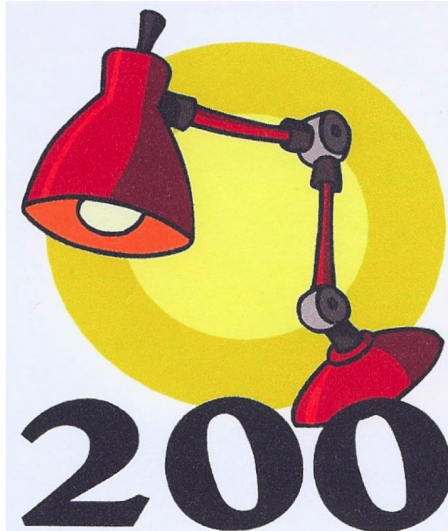

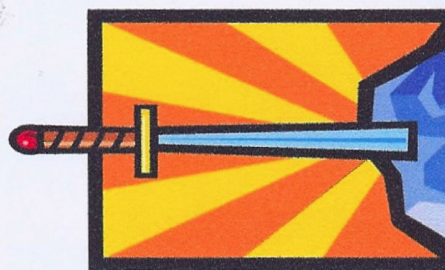

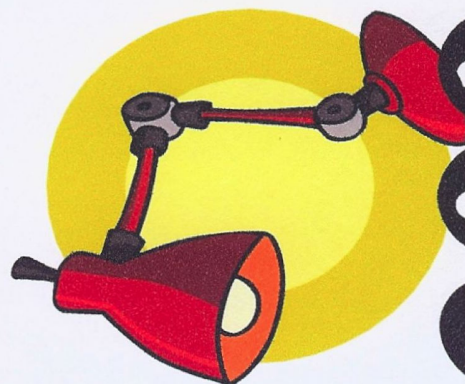

Quiz Me Questions

Quiz Me Lesson 1:

Today's questions are all about God's Word, the Bible, and why it is important to us. The Bible can be described in many ways. For example it is the Holy Scriptures, the Sword of the Spirit, a Lamp to our feet, a devouring flame, a crushing hammer and best of all it's living and active!

Quiz Me Question 1:

The Bible can be described...

Quiz Me Lesson 2:

We just learned of several ways to describe God's Word, the Bible, but one word that should NEVER be used to describe the Bible is boring. In fact, the Bible is living and active. Hebrews 4:12 says, "For the Word of God is living and active, sharper than any double-edged sword. It penetrates, dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow. It judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart." WOW! That doesn't sound boring to me. If anything, those words make the Bible sound exciting!

Extra Bonus: How To Play Bible Baseball

Set Up: You will need 4 bases - one home plate, one 1st base, one 2nd base, and one 3rd base. You will also need one card of each of the following titles - Home Run, Single, Double, and Triple. Place the bases on the ground in baseball diamond fashion and place the cards in a bucket.

How to Play: Pick one child from each team. Decide who goes first. Give the child a Quiz Me Card Quiz. If he/she gets it correct, they now get the chance to pick a card out of the bucket. If they pick the single card they move to first base, the double card moves them to second base, the triple card moves them to third base and the Home Run card gives them an automatic home run. Place the chosen card back into the bucket.

The second child from the 2nd team goes next and follows the same procedure as the first child. More than one person can be on a base at a time.

Now pick a new child from the first team. Have the child follow the same procedure. Whatever card he/she picks will also move ahead any of his team members that are already on another base. For example, if a Team A child is on 2nd base and another Team A child comes "up to bat" and picks a double card, the first Team A child now goes to Home plate and scores a run for their team while his teammate goes to second base.

The team with the most home runs at the end of the set of Quiz Me Questions, wins!
